WESPA enjoyed an increase in membership income in 2014, and it was heartening to see Ghana, Uganda and Zambia in the lists. By contrast, there was a decline in tournament-related income following an unusual surge in 2013. Our expenditure remained fairly constant, but we did suffer an exchange loss in relation to the funds which are partially held in Australian dollars. WESPA also donated \$300 to the US Nationals to foster the adoption of CSW there, and it seems that momentum is continuing to grow. Overall, the surplus was a little less than 2013 at around \$1,800, and this has contributed to a net increase in reserves backed mainly by bank and PayPal balances.

AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF WESPA

I have audited the accompanying financial statements of the World English Language Scrabble Players Association (WESPA) as at 31st December, 2014, and the related support documents/bank statements for the year ended 31st December, 2014. The financial statements are the responsibility of the WESPA Treasurer. My responsibility is to express an opinion on the financial statements based on my audit.

This special purpose financial report has been prepared solely for the purpose of reporting to members, and is not intended to be lodged under any national jurisdiction. It has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs. No specific Accounting Standards have been intentionally applied.

I conducted the planning and performance of the WESPA's audit in accordance with the Generally Accepted Auditing Standards. I considered the WESPA's internal control structure and system in place, in order to assess its validity and relevance to the WESPA's business, to determine my auditing procedures, and for the purpose of expressing my opinion on the financial statements. I examined on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. No specific Accounting Standards have been intentionally applied.

I believe the audit provides a reasonable basis for my opinion.

In my opinion, proper accounting records have been kept by the Committee and Treasurer. Financial controls and principles have been consistently applied and the financial accounts are in agreement with the accounting records kept during the period under review. The financial statements present a True and Fair view of the accounts and the state of affairs of the World English Language Scrabble Players Association (WESPA), and the results of its operations, in all material aspects as at December 31, 2014.
